

Galerie Negropontes

Three-dimensional printing once had a distant relationship with the mainstream, cloistered in a restricted-access laboratory of science and time travel. The technology finally comes home: Origami, a striking

solid-brass hardware collection by Hervé Langlais, the artistic director of Galerie Negropontes, emerged with assistance from a 3-D printer. Modeling software, ergonomic testing, and imagination, this neoteric turn at utility showcases Langlais's passion for geometric forms melded with fine materials. The patinated brass finish contrasts the triangular facets of the handle (\$497) and doorstop (\$174), all for Sophie Negropontes's Paris design gallery. Winter is coming, and not only in Game of Thrones. For cozying up, Chesney's, a London-based purveyor of fireplaces and stoves, offers a new line of mantels from American designer Eric Cohler. Taking cues from the industrial revolution, Cohler placed himself in a 19th-century architectural state of mind to fuse steel and stone for four variants. Tresserra Collection

The Spanish artisan brand Tresserra Collection received a custom request from a client. He craved a desk for his home office that did not resemble the typical executive characters, and one that could moonlight as a meeting table. The Oliverio (\$57,000), named after that patron, is a wish fulfilled in light walnut and stainless-steel detailing. The desk was handmade in the company's Barcelona atelier, where founder Jaime

Tresserra conceived of hidden compartments, inconspicuous task lighting,



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
